




- Negotiation

- Offensive Language
- Threats against victim or family
- False expectations
- Mutilation: real or simulated
- Torture or violation: real or simulated
- Mock Executions
- Silence & uncertainty to punish the family








- Release
 - Preparation of “Package”, Vehicle and Driver
 - Certification of Funds
 - Final Proof of Life
 - Delivery
















- Post Release
 - Debriefing
 - Facts of Loss
 - Negotiation
 - Reintegration
 - Counseling
