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HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION



- Have a local organization place signs in your public restrooms offering help for people who are being trafficked.
 - Frequently train and retrain your staff on what signs to look for when people are being trafficked.
 - Develop a system to react to a potential trafficker (know who to call, how to keep the other guests safe, etc.)
 - When possible, do not allow cash as a form of payment.
 - Require a valid ID with any registration.
 - Look for guests who check-in then go back to their vehicles to bring in several people.
 - Notice if several visitors go to the same room on the same day or evening.
 - Have visible security cameras by all entrances and exits and as necessary at least one guard on the property.
 - Look for guests who are unusually watched over, possibly malnourished or overly tired.
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
